MINISTRY WITH FAMILIES

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Ministry with Families is a series of courses for those in any phase of ministry in church and school settings. Available in both English and Spanish, it equips clergy and religious, parish staff, lay leaders, teachers and volunteers with theological vision - as well as practical tools and techniques -for comprehensive and creative ministry with families.

New Perspectives

The Ministry with Families series of courses is designed to promote a "family perspective" and a systems approach to ministry. The course also encourages the development of a "multi-cultural perspective" – an awareness of the diversity present in family life today, which in turn calls for different kinds of strategies for ministry.

Whole Community Catechesis Finally, Ministry with Families courses emphasize faith formation as an ongoing and lifelong process that is supported by inter-generational learning within the family itself.

Ministry with Families 101

This leadership formation course is designed to be an introduction to ministry from a family perspective. It addresses the needs of those who are new to this topic or of those who are seeking a review and renewal of their knowledge.

It is an experiential learning process that assists the individual minister to integrate his/her learning at a personal as well as a ministerial level. Incorporating a family perspective in ministry is a central theme throughout the process. Participants gain knowledge and insights about the domestic church and increase their capacity for ministry with and among families.

Ministry with Families 201

This formation process is designed for those who have completed the course, Ministry with Families 101, and for others who have already had extensive experience in bringing a family perspective to their ministry.

Participants will gain a deeper understanding of marriage and family throughout the life cycle, with a concentration on the theological, Scriptural, spiritual and ministerial dimensions of this topic. The process will provide a forum for developing new insights into how to form "bridges" between the family and the larger Church.

Ministry with Families 301

Each Ministry with Families 301 course is individually designed for a specific group (clergy, religious, university students, lay movement leaders, etc.) as part of their continuing education. It is based on the content of Ministry with Families 101 and Ministry with Families 201, and the content that addresses the particular needs of the participants. A Ministry with Families 301 course may vary in length to conform to the group's time frame.

Local Site Expenses

Costs for each course include a license to print course materials, as well as stipends and travel expenses for the team of two NACFLM instructors. Depending on the site and timing, there will be additional expenses for printing, refreshments and/or meals (and overnight accommodations) for instructors and/or participants.

These costs can be included in the registration fee or partially absorbed by the diocese, parish, or organization.
